Community Patrols of New Zealand was established in 2001 after Taupo Night Owls and their Community Constable realised there must be several similar groups around the country and it would be advantageous if they got together and united as a National Body. After making contact with as many groups as they could find, a conference was held wherein CPNZ was formally established.



Being a Charitable Trust, CPNZ is totally self funded by donations and/or grants.

The main focus of CPNZ is to assist Police in providing a safe environment by undertaking patrols in and around the communities, reporting anything unusual, unsecured premises and suspicious vehicles in their area. They are the 'eyes and ears of the Police, who cannot be everywhere.

CPNZ Sanson held it's inaugural meeting in January 2011 for a newly formed group. Currently there are 5 members and we would welcome more interested persons to contact us, to ensure patrol requirements are met and provide a Community Service.
